This project brought young people together to explore that digital reality, reflect on how media shapes us, and rethink our own place in the online world. Through shared moments and creative activities, participants gained a clearer, more conscious perspective on the digital spaces they use every day.

WHAT DO WE WANT REACH

OBJECTIVES

- 1. Understand how media informs, educates, and entertains, and how these roles impact our daily lives.
- 2. Develop key digital skills: critical thinking, self-awareness, and self-organisation—for better online self-management.
- 3. Gain confidence in using digital tools for personal and professional growth through activities on self-expression, communication, and virtual networking..

OUR AIM

The goal of the project is to support young people in building the digital skills they need to understand and use media in a conscious, informed way.



THE STORY

The story of this project started with a simple moment in Gliwice, Poland, when five participants: Greta, Kristaps, Giulia, Markus and Natalia, noticed how often they were reaching for their phones instead of focusing on each other. This sparked an honest conversation about digital overload and the feeling of being constantly pulled into the online world. Wanting to understand this better, they began researching the topic and asking themselves how young people could feel more in control of their digital lives. Encouraged to develop their ideas further, they shaped a Youth Exchange that helps people understand their digital habits, learn new skills, and feel more in control of their online lives.

OUR METHODOLOGY

NON-FORMAL EDUCATION

CREATIVE / INTERACTIVE METHODS

Participants took part in theatrebased workshops, role-playing scenarios, simulations, and dynamic group tasks.



CREATIVE DIGITAL METHODS



We explored Al tools and social media, creating images, videos, and music tracks while discovering new ways to express ourselves online.

Participants worked in mixednationality teams, shared perspectives, and learned from each other
